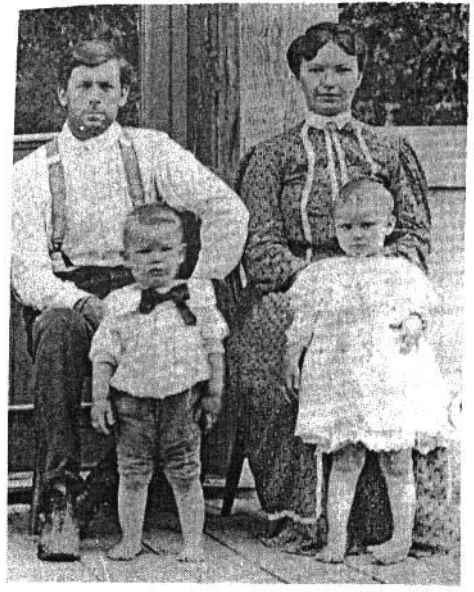

RUTH C. FIELDS

Ruth C. Fields was born Jan 2, 1894 three and one-half miles south-east of Grove Springs, Delaware District, Indian Territory. She was the seventh child of Timothy and Laura Jane Fields who were farmers. They married Sept 14, 1879 and moved to the farm in 1880 where they raised 8 children (two died in infancy).

The schools she attended were Olympus, Carr, Grove and the Cherokee National Female Seminary in Tahlequah. After the Seminary closed she attended Northeastern State. Ruth was also a graduate of a business college and Mrs. Hamms Beauty School in Tulsa.

Ruth taught school for several years and later kept books and helped her husband in the Oklahoma Furniture and Auction Company. They also bought and sold antiques.

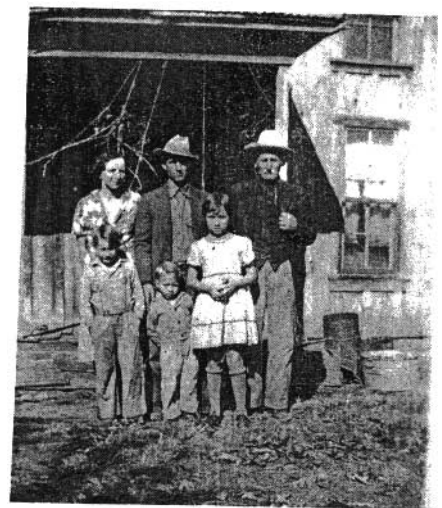
A religious person, Ruth was always visiting and seeing after older and lonely persons, just as her mother had done.
